

## **TEACHING SUPPORT SERVICES & PROGRAMS**

#### **Instructional Consulting**

Instructional consulting services are customized to fit faculty members' needs. The faculty member will meet one-on-one with a center staff member to discuss goals and/or instructional issues and then develop a plan. Examples include assistance with planning a new course, designing a syllabus, using instructional strategies, and designing assignments.

#### **Teaching Observations**

A center staff member will observe you teaching and then meet with you to discuss the observation, provide suggestions for improvement, and send you a written summary. For more information about the different types of observations that the center offers, visit our website.

#### Mid-Semester Feedback

A mid-semester feedback session is an opportunity to receive structured feedback from your students regarding the functioning of the class and the quality of student learning. What aspects of the class are going well? What changes in the course delivery would benefit student learning? A center staff member will visit your class and engage students in a small group instructional diagnosis technique. Student feedback is then prioritized, summarized, and shared with you in a follow-up meeting.

#### Program/Departmental Consulting

The center partners with programs and departments to offer customized services. Examples of these services include curriculum mapping, customized workshops retreats, customized certificates, support for departmental initiatives, and program/departmental specific course design.

#### Scholarship of Teaching and Learning (SoTL)

To support faculty interested in conducting and publishing their teaching as research, the center offers workshops, consulting, grants, and a writing retreat.

#### **Learning Communities**

Learning communities pursue interdisciplinary inquiry into specific issues and questions about teaching and learning in higher education. Through meaningful collective inquiry, the learning communities program seeks to foster a collegial environment that values pedagogical exploration and promotes collaborative learning.
